Just a quick break down on what we at the Atoka Assembly of God were we were able to give from the last 2 loads from Kaleo. Approximately 200 bags made up and distributed by the Centrahoma Baptist Church into the communities of Tupelo and Centrahoma, OK. Approximately 150 bags distributed by several churches in Hayworth, OK. Approximately 100 bags distributed through Community Center in Finley, OK. 400 bags distributed to the children of Atoka, OK at the Christmas Parade. 250 children's bags and 50 teachers bags to Lane School in Lane, OK. Approximately 60 bags distributed by Lane Baptist Church to their families in Lane, OK. 22 bags to the Amish children at the Amish school in Clarita, OK. 120 bags distributed by Antlers Assembly of God during their Christmas Program in Antlers, OK. 50 bags distributed by Farris Assembly of God for Christmas to our people in Farris, OK. That's over 1400 blessing bags made possible by the generosity of The Kaleo Foundation.

Who was served: kids, low-income families

Our volunteers: They were overjoyed (We patterned with Putnam Baptist Church)

Impact: We have made meaningful relationships with those in that neighborhood. We know young teens and their parents and play soccer with them. We have started meeting some parents doing a Bible study, and we want to expand. We connected with the HOA leaders. They came to the event, stayed to the end of our time, and were very appreciative.

- Now, whenever I go there, he greets me with a hug, and we hold hands to pray to God in a circle
- At the beginning of this month, he called me personally to ask for \$200 in help to pay his rent. Our church decided to bless his family by paying his entire rent. We continue to love this family and many more because **Kaleo Foundation** and **Children's Hunger Fund** are helping us.
